

Do It Yourself

NEWSLETTER

You will be creating a one page newsletter on a topic of your choice. It can be real or fake, serious or funny as long as it follows the requirements below.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- at least one full page
- Nameplate section with:
 - creative title (NOT "Newsletter")
 - o date
 - subtitle or issue # (optional)
 - o border
- 2-4 columns (your choice)
- <u>at least</u> 1 headline (no larger than 18pt font)
- 1 "pull quote"
- 1 drop cap
- 1 to 2 pictures (no more than 2 pictures and no bigger than 1.5"x1.5")
- nameplate section should not come below 2" on the page
- the body text should be no larger than 12pt
- a footer with your name in the bottom right corner of the page

PARTS OF A NEWSLETTER

1. Nameplate

The banner on the front of a newsletter that identifies the publication is its nameplate. The nameplate usually contains the name of the newsletter, possibly graphics or a logo, and perhaps a subtitle, motto, and publication information including Volume and Issue or Date.

2. Headlines and Subheads

After the nameplate, the headline identifying each article in a newsletter is the most prominent text element. Subheads appear within the body of articles to divide the article into smaller sections.

Create a Headline Hierarchy:

Size helps establish importance. When using multiple sizes of headlines, create an obvious hierarchy with size. Make sure there is a distinct difference between each headline or subhead level. As an alternative to size only, create contrast with both size and fonts by using different fonts within the same font family, such as bold for the main headlines and condensed for the secondary headlines.

3. Body



^{**}Save the newsletter as DIY Newsletter and turn it in on the P2P website.

The body of the newsletter is the bulk of the text excluding the text elements. It's the articles that make up the newsletter content.

4. Pull-Ouotes


Used to attract attention, especially in long articles, a pull quote is a small selection of text "pulled out and quoted" in a larger typeface. A pull-quote may be framed by rules, placed within the article, span multiple columns, or be placed in an empty column near the article. Pull-quotes provide a teaser that entices the reader into the story.

- **a.** Choose appropriate snippets for pull-quotes.
- **b.** Keep pull-quotes brief and to the point.
- Make pull-quotes stand apart from accompanying text.

5. Drop Caps/Borders/Photos / Illustrations

A newsletter's layout may contain drop caps or borders to add design elements to it. Photographs, drawings, charts, graphs, or clip art may provide information and/or add to a newsletter's design.
